Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to welcome all of our families back to school and I hope everybody had a lovely half term break. As you may be aware both Mrs Wadsworth and Mrs Storer are now on mat leave- we wish them well and I will update as and when they have any happy news to share.

I would like to say a massive well done to everybody who entered the Art competition, we had a fantastic response and the children have enjoyed seeing their artwork displayed around school. We will be sending details for the next competition soon.

Next week we have lots going on in school:

- Mon 11th Remembrance at Elworth: we passionately believe in teaching children how lessons from the past can impact on their life and learning today. This is one of the most poignant and powerful experiences we use to help children understand the cost of conflict. We will be observing the two minutes silence on Monday morning and watching the service at the Cenotaph in London. The younger children will be taught this through a range of visually appropriate resources. The older children will be doing various pieces of written and art work based on poetry and texts detailing the experiences of conflict.
- Tues 12th- Fri 15th Odd Socks Anti Bullying Week: children are encouraged to wear odd socks all week to celebrate that being different is great- our uniqueness is God given! The childrens learning will be focussed on Conflict Resolution- how to build and sustain good friendship and what to do when things go 'pear shaped'. This work will finish with a **Prayer Space on Friday** where Mrs Rookes, Cathryn and myself will help the children reflect on and value their friendships and how they can protect themselves from getting into situations which lead to arguments and division. EYFS and Y1 work will be focussed on a children's story, Y2-4 will be using the story of Joseph and his brothers from the bible and Y5-6 will be looking at the use of phones, social media and communications to build strong friendships and also identify when communications are going the wrong way and what to do about it.
- Bikeability- Can your child ride a bike? Are they confident at balancing? Do they enjoy scootering?

 Bikeability lessons for our EYFS and Year 1 classes have been arranged by Mr Darby our PE leader (We already have Bikeability courses for children in Y4 and Y6) he is passionate about all children being physically confident in as many different environments and ways as possible. If your child can already ride a bike- wonderful! They will really enjoy showing off their skills to their peers- to those who aren't riding yet we know that this will inspire them to love riding a bike and hopefully enjoy more outdoor experiences. Watch this space for further courses for children in Y2 and Y3.





- It's Chocolate Bingo time again- it will take place in the main hall on Wednesday 13th from 6:30 p.m.. It's 50 p a ticket and £3 for a bingo book- we will play three games and as always there will be lots of winners! This is great fun and there are lots of prizes to be won. 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PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE ARE CHANGING!

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force on 19 August 2024.

Penalty Notices will be issued for

Term time leave: Penalty Notice fines will be issued for term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days.

10 Sessions of Unauthorised absence in a rolling 10 week period: A Penalty Notices may be considered when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised absences in a 10 week period.

However, we retain the discretion to issue a Penalty Notice before the threshold is met. For example, where parents are deliberately avoiding the national threshold by taking several term time holidays below the above thresholds.

Per Parent/Per Child

Penalty Notice fines will continue to be issued per parent per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular school attendance the fine will be charged at:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days of the issue, reducing to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

(Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution)

Second Offence

Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second penalty notice to the same parent for the same pupil within 3 years of the first penalty notice, for either term time leave or irregular attendance the second penalty notice will be charged at:

£160 if paid within 28 days. (Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution)

Third Offence

On the third time that an offence is committed within 3 years of the first penalty notice for either a term time leave or irregular attendance a penalty notice will not be issued. The case may proceed to Parental Prosecution under the Single Justice Procedure. If found guilty of the offence of 'Failure to send a child to school' the Magistrates can impose a fine up to £1000 or legal proceedings under Section444 (1a) can include a fine of up to £2500.


